



## Hot Tub Housekeeping

Maintaining your hot tub is EASY if you remember a few steps to help keep your Hot Spring or Sundance spa looking like new!

### Clean and condition your Spa Cover:

- Remove the cover and lightly spray it with a garden hose to remove any dirt or debris.
- Concentrating on the 'water-side' of the cover, pour cover cleaner (by BaquaSpa or Brilliance for spas) in a 6"-9" diameter puddle onto the cover and scrub with the BaquaSpa scrub pad.
- Rinse the cover thoroughly and place it back on your spa. Pour a 2"-3" puddle of cover cleaner on the top of the cover and scrub it thoroughly.
- Rinse completely.
- After your cover dries, spray on "303 Aerospace Protectant" and wipe dry.

*If cared for properly, your cover can last up to 5 years!*

### Clean your hot tub shell:

- Every time you drain and refill your spa, use a mild non-abrasive, non-sudsing cleaner and a soft scrubber to remove dirt on your spa's surface.
- If you have stains or tough dirt on the surface of your spa, use BaquaSpa or Brilliance for Spas Surface Cleaner.
- Clean your pillows regularly according to the instructions found in your owner's manual.

### Clean your hot tub filter(s):

- It is vitally important that you clean your hot tub filter.
- See the detailed instructions for general filter care, Tri-X filters care and Micro-Clean II filter care.

### Drain your hot tub water:

- If you properly maintain your water chemistry, you will only have to drain your hot tub's water 3-4 times per year.
- Always consult your hot tub owner's manual to see what your specific hot tub model requires for draining the water.
- Turn the power to the spa off.
- Locate drain on the front, base of spa, near equipment area. (See Owners Manual for exact location).
- Attach garden hose and drain.
- After your spa is drained then close the drain and replace cap.
- Refer to Filling procedures in your owner's manual.
- If winterizing spa, follow detailed steps in Owner's Manual or contact our store to schedule a service tech to come to your home. Due to the liability of winterizing, we cannot explain how to do this over the phone. Damage caused to your spa by improper winterizing is NOT covered by your spa warranty.
- **DO NOT** change your spa water when the temperature is below freezing.
