

Doylestown's Cull earns Eagle Scout

Alexander P. Cull of Doylestown Boy Scout Troop 6 was awarded the rank of Eagle Scout during a May 8 Eagle Court of Honor at the Doylestown United Methodist Church, sponsor of the troop.

Guest speakers included Pastor Steve McComas of Rolling Hills United Methodist Church and Michael Sorgi, Alex's lifelong friend.

Cull began his scouting career as a Tiger Scout in Pack 207 of Buckingham Elementary in 1998. He joined Troop 6 in 2002 and has attended eight summer camps. In 2006 and 2008, he attended a two-week backpacking trek at Philmont

Scout Reservation in Cimarron, N.M., and in 2008, the crew leader.

Cull's troop responsibilities have included senior patrol leader, patrol leader, troop guide and instructor. He is also an Ordeal member in the Order of the Arrow, Ajapen Lodge.
