

Jake Revere honored with Spirit of the Eagle Award

Jake R. Revere, a Boy Scout who lost his life in 2008, was honored with the Spirit of the Eagle Award at a ceremony at Doylestown United Methodist Church, which sponsors Troop 6.

Jake's father and mother, Richard and Robin, and sisters Kacey, Kellie and Sophie accepted the award that the Boy Scouts of America has established for scouts who have lost their lives.

Jake attained the rank of Life Scout in less than three years. He had only to complete his Leadership Project in order to attain Eagle, the highest rank in Boy Scouts. His planned project, the building of two exercise stations on the walking path at Lake Nockamixon, was completed following his death, by his fellow

scouts, friends and community volunteers.

Jake moved through the ranks of scouting with great speed and enthusiasm and never missed an opportunity to help with service projects in his community and church.

Jake earned 24 merit badges, attended five summer camps, spent 110 nights camping, achieved Brotherhood status in the Order of the Arrow, attended the 2005 National Jamboree, and attended the renowned Philmont Scout Ranch in 2006. At the Klondike Derby in 2008, he led his crew of new young scouts to a second-place victory for the Lenape District, inspiring them with his zest for life and can-do attitude all the way.
